I am so grateful to my own wolfpack for all the support I received throughout this process and want to extend a special thanks to Head Coach Bob Sheehan and all the coaches and athletes of the NKU Women's Soccer Team who shared so generously their time and talent to help us prepare for the unique physical demands of this production. NORSE UP!

It has been an absolute joy to work with the cast and creative team of The Wolves for the past six months to bring this incredible script to life. When I first read the play I was struck by how familiar these characters sounded to me – not only because I work with young women on a daily basis in my teaching, or because I was a seventeen year-old girl once experiencing some of these same adolescent discoveries, but because the issues the characters grapple with during their daily warm-ups are not confined to our adolescence: balancing responsibilities to our team while maintaining our individuality, advocating for justice while feeling powerless within a system that can feel overwhelming and complex, navigating issues of social status, change and loss. The playwright includes a quote by Gertrude Stein on the first page of the script: "We are always the same age inside." For me, this play confirms the truth of that statement time and time again.

The actors in this cast have been training since May – working with a personal trainer on strength and conditioning, learning warm-ups and passing drills, and improving their ball handling and footwork to rise to the demands of this play and embody their characters with authenticity and integrity – a testament to their commitment to their craft and to each other. I am eager to celebrate their hard work with you as I now take my seat on the bench.

I am honored to be part of this production and have loved watching The Wolves learn and grow together as a team. Thank you to Nicole, who taught and showed me how to be a powerful female director. This play showcases teenagers in a transitional time of their lives. The juxtaposition of girlhood and womanhood is something that they are grappling to figure out. The beautiful part of college students performing this play is that we too are in a transitional period of life. How do we hold onto our childlike innocence while still looking forward to the future? I think learning from these characters has and will help us answer that question. ### **PROFILES**

**Nicole Perrone (Director)** joined theatre faculty as a Lecturer and Retention Specialist in 2017 after spending seven years at Marshall University where she was a tenured Associate Professor of Acting and Movement. There she co-founded the Marshall University Center for Wellness in the Arts and also served as one of its directors. Nicole is a certified teacher of the Alexander Technique (ATI), and a certified teacher of the Michael Chekhov Technique through the Great Lakes Michael Chekhov Consortium. A member of Actors' Equity Association and SAG-AFTRA, Nicole has worked professionally for twenty-five years as an actor, teacher and director. With theatre-maker Matthew Earnest, she co-founded the Lunar Stratagem, an Equity non-profit theatre committed to the creation of original work. With the Lunar Stratagem, Nicole has appeared in [glug], Can You Forgive Her?, I, Ca\$\$ie...or the end of days (English Theatre Berlin), and Dead Letter Office (a prelude to Bartleby the Scrivener). Professional credits include Disney (National Tour), Porthouse Theatre, Cleveland Public Theatre, St. Michael's Playhouse, Franklin Stage, Ice Factory Festival NYC, Berkshire Fringe, Manhattan Drama Collective, Back House Productions (dir. Thomas Kail) and dozens of commercials and industrials for clients such as Progressive, PNC, Armani, Kroger, Disney, and Limited Brands. Nicole teaches courses in advanced acting and solo performance.

Michael W. Hatton (Producing Artistic Director) is an Associate Professor, serving as Head of the NKU Theatre & Dance Program. Mr. Hatton has served in various forms of university governance and service in the past twenty years. Mr. Hatton also serves as Chair of the executive board of the Cooperative Center for Study Abroad (CCSA) and is an active education abroad administrator and teacher, specifically in the United Kingdom. He has worked with multiple educational theatre programs, including the Cincinnati Cappies, CAST, the Children's Theatre of Cincinnati, Uptown Arts, and many others. Mr. Hatton has served as chair of the Pedagogy Symposium for the Mid-America Theatre Conference, and presented research and workshops at various conferences. Additionally, Mr. Hatton has won awards for teaching, including from the Greater Cincinnati Consortium of Colleges and University as well as the NKU Michael C.C. and Susan S. Adams Outstanding Non-Tenure Track Faculty award. Mr. Hatton is a freelance director and stage manager having worked with several regional companies including the Cincinnati Arts Association, Lincoln Boyhood Drama Association, Cincinnati Overture Awards, Showstoppers/Belterra Casino, Cincinnati Men's Chorus, Professional Concepts, the New Edgecliff Theatre, and the Performance Gallery. Mr. Hatton received his MFA in Theatre Pedagogy and Directing from Virginia Commonwealth University.

**Ronnie Chamberlain (Costume Designer)** is an Associate Professor of Theatre & Dance in Costume Design, Technology and Makeup. Ronnie Chamberlain is actively involved in United States Institute for Theater technology, serving on the Conference Committee for many years. Ms. Chamberlain serves as Vice Chair of Operations for the Ohio Valley Section of USITI. She is also active in Southeatern Theatre conference and the Kennedy Cetner American college Theatre Festival. As a cosutme designer, her work has been seen in productions at the Oklahoma Shakespeare Festival, Haricake Productions, The University of Alabama, Relevance Productions, Open Stage Theatre, and The Blackhills Playhouse. Some of her favorite past designs include *Pride and Prejudice, Cabaret, Godspell, Disney's Beauty and Beast, and As You Like It.* 

**Cat Schmeal-Swope (Costume Shop Manager)** is a Costume Technician & Designer based in the Greater Cincinnati area. Cat is also Adjunct Professor in the Theatre and Dance Program, where she teaches TAR 160-Stagecraft Costumes. Various regional costume design credits include: Howard Crabtree's When Pigs Fly (NKU), Beautiful: The Carol King Musical (The Carnegie), Hands on a Hardbody (Ensemble Theatre Cincy), 9 to 5 (NKU), Little Shop of Horrors (The Carnegie), The African Company Presents Richard III (NKU), Around the World in 80 Days (The Human Race Theatre Company), Daddy Long Legs (CATCO), Othello (Ohio St. U. in collaboration w. Royal Shakespeare Co.), True West (Minnesota St. U. Mankato). Besides her design work, Cat has also worked for numerous companies as a Cutter/Draper including Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park. Cat holds an MFA in Theatre Design from The Ohio State University and

a BFA in Theatre with an emphasis in costumes from Northern Kentucky University. Cat would like to send gratitude to all her NKU costume lab students for their hard work and dedication to each production the program produces.

**Rob Kerby (Technical Director, Scenic Designer)** is a 1987 alumni of the Theatre & Dance Program with a BFA in Theatre Technology and also received his MFA in 2001 from the University of Illinois in Theatre Technology. He has worked at various educational and professional settings including Walt Disney World, The Ohio State University, Indiana State University and The Krannert Center for the Performing Arts at the University of Illinois.
