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DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

A couple of years ago I was asked this question: "If you could direct any Shakespeare play, what would it be?" There was no hesitation in my answer. It had to be Henry V. At the time I didn't know where the conversation was leading, namely to me serving as a director for the 24-25 NKU main stage season. Why Henry V, you ask? What's so special about this play? Well, the short answer is that it has a little bit of everything Shakespeare – history, intrigue, romance, battle, humor, comradery, and a great story. But that isn't enough of a reason. Why Henry V now?

What makes a great leader? Is it a compelling vision? Stirring words? Demonstrated mercy, strength, power? And who or what determines if a leader is right, or moral, or responsible? Henry V is full of stirring speeches, questions of rightness, and demonstrations of power. It is my hope that through this story you find those questions to be compelling, to cause you to think about the relevance and importance of the role and accountability of leaders, and how much citizens play a role in a leader's motives and actions.

This production will encourage you, the audience, to use your creative imagination to help us bring this story into being. "O for a Muse of fire, that would ascend the brightest heaven of invention, A kingdom for a stage, princes to act, and monarchs to behold the swelling scene." The scope and scale of the Hundred Years War could not possibly be contained in our small theatre but can be forged in our combined fancies. You won't see lavish medieval costumes, live horses, English longbows, or great sailing ships carrying Henry across the sea to France. There aren't vast castles or battlefields, nor hundreds of citizens and soldiers. In place of all that grandeur "Let us, ciphers to this great accompt, on your imaginary forces work."

DRAMATURG'S NOTE:

As the Dramaturg, my role is to be the bridge between the world of the play and the audience. I work with the cast and creative team to provide historical, cultural, and literary context, ensuring Shakespeare's text is accessible and engaging for our audiences. I am drawn to Henry V because of its exploration of morality, humanity, and leadership. Shakespeare's ability to fully capture the complexity of human nature through his language is unmatched. Shakespeare's works are like learning another language, challenging and mysterious at first, but once understood they reveal such beauty and depth. Researching Henry V has been a process of learning about the historical figure behind the myth and examining how his story is important today. Henry is an extremely fascinating character, a young leader balancing responsibility and doubt, making him extremely relatable. As an artist myself, I connected with Henry's journey of self-discovery and his efforts to overcome the challenges before him. I accepted the position of Dramaturg because I think, as an actor, it is important to understand the entire world of the play to enrich the storytelling experience for both the actors and the audience. I am very excited to dive into Shakespeare's world and bring clarity to this show, sharing the power of his words within our community.

PROFILES

Jo Sanburg (Director) is a lighting and sound designer for theatre, pyrotechnics, and multimedia, and a composer. She holds an M.F.A. in Design and Technology from the University of Memphis, and a B.A. in Music and Education from Loretto Heights College. Jo also serves on the USITT Lighting Commission as Vice Commissioner for Education and Training. Jo's lighting design credits include *Peter and the Starcatcher, The Lightning Thief, The Princess Plays, In the Heights, Marie Antoinette, Cosi Fan Tutte*, and the world premiere of Kenley Smith's *Empires of Eternal Void*. Her sound designs include *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde, Henry V, The Comedy of Errors, The 39 Steps, The Secret in the Wings, As You Like It*, and *Anon(ymous)*. Jo has won numerous awards for her design work, including the John T. Spiegel Award for Excellence in Design, Peggy Ezekiel Award of Distinction, Ezekiel Award for Outstanding Achievement, Ostrander Award for Excellence in Sound Design, and the Southeastern Theatre Conference's Award for Excellence in Sound Design. She has designed lights for the American College Dance Association, and her sound design work was exhibited at the 2019 Prague Quadrennial.

Jamey Strawn (Producing Artistic Director) is a full professor in the NKU Theatre and Dance program, where he serves as the coordinator of musical theatre. Aside from teaching musical theatre courses, he enjoys teaching with CCSA in the study abroad program to London. Jamey has composed music for several published works for the stage, including SLEEPING BEAUTY-RISE AND SHINE, A. LINCOLN: A PIONEER TALE, SNOW WHITE AND THE DANCING DWARFS, THE DAY BEFORE CHRISTMAS, CHURCH GIRLS, and BURGERTOWN. When he is not writing, Jamey is directing, musical directing, performing, and teaching. He has performed regionally with the Broadway Tour Productions of TINA: the TINA TURNER MUSICAL, JERSEY BOYS, WICKED, Disney'S THE LITTLE MERMAID, BEAUTIFUL: The Carole King Musical, EVITA, FLASHDANCE, LEGALLY BLONDE, MONTY PYTHON'S SPAMALOT, A CHORUS LINE, THE SOUND OF MUSIC, and WEST SIDE STORY in Cincinnati, Cleveland, Louisville, Lexington, Columbus, and Indianapolis. Recent directing credits include AMELIE, VIOLET, PERCY JACKSON-A LIGHTNING THIEF MUSICAL, FUGITIVE SONGS, EDGES, BIG FISH, THOROUGHLY MODERN MILLIE, and INTO THE WOODS at Northern Kentucky University. He has been the Musical Director for many successful productions, including THE PRINCESS PLAYS, THE MYSTERY OF EDWIN DROOD, BURGERTOWN, ROCK OF AGES, SPELLING BEE, LES MISERABLES, SWEENEYTODD, MONTY PYTHON'S SPAMALOT, and many more.

Ronnie Chamberlain (Faculty Costume Design Mentor) is an Associate Professor of Theatre & Dance in Costume Design, Technology and Makeup. Ronnie Chamberlain is actively involved in United States Institute for Theater Technology, serving on the Conference Committee for many years. Ms. Chamberlain serves as Vice Chair of Operations for the Ohio Valley Section of USITT. She is also active in Southeatern Theatre conference and the Kennedy Cetner American college Theatre Festival. As a cosutme designer, her work has been seen in productions at the Oklahoma Shakespeare Festival, Haricake Productions, The University of Alabama, Relevance Productions, Open Stage Theatre, and The Blackhills Playhouse. Some of her favorite past designs include *Pride and Prejudice, Cabaret, Godspell, Disney's Beauty and Beast, and As You Like It.*

Cat Schmeal-Swope (Costume Shop Manager) is a Costume Technician & Designer based in the Greater Cincinnati area. Cat is also Adjunct Professor in the Theatre and Dance Program, where she teaches TAR 160-Stagecraft Costumes. 
