

Kentucky Reading Project



Kentucky Reading Project (KRP) is a professional development initiative for Kentucky public school elementary (P-5) teachers designed to increase student achievement and family involvement in literacy. This yearlong, graduate level literacy course consists of a summer institute, follow-up sessions during the year, and at least one coaching visit to each teacher.

How will teachers benefit?

- A stipend, professional books, and resources
- Three hours of graduate credit upon completion of the course in May 2023
- Collegial support through continued networking and onsite visits by a KRP coach to provide support and dialogue
- Strengthened literacy knowledge and instructional practices in classroom settings
