



## TWO DEGREES, ONE PATH

### TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE 2025-2026

#### Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Social Work

##### ***Overview***

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for an Associate in Arts (AA) at Gateway Community and Technical College (GCTC) and leads to the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) at Northern Kentucky University (NKU).

##### ***Applying to the Gateway2NKU Program***

Students can apply to participate in the pathway program by completing the online application on the NKU transfer webpage. Students must be enrolled in at least six credit hours at Gateway CTC, enrolled in an associate degree program, plan to transfer to NKU, and maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA at Gateway CTC.

##### ***Degree Requirements for GCTC***

1. Completion of minimum 60 credit hours
2. Minimum cumulative GPA 2.0,
3. Minimum of 25 percent of credit hours required for the degree earned at the institution awarding the degree
4. Demonstration of digital literacy.
5. College success requirement

##### ***Admission Requirements for NKU***

Students completing an associate degree with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher will be accepted into NKU.

Note: To move on to Phase 2 in the path to a Bachelor of Social Work at NKU, students must earn a C- or better in six required pre-requisite courses (SWK 105, SWK 106, SWK 204, SWK 205, SWK 206), and a 3 hour statistics course or the GCTC equivalent courses (SWK 124, SWK 106U, and STA 251 or STA 220) and have maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.75.

##### ***Degree Requirements for NKU***

To graduate with a bachelor's at NKU, a student must:

1. Complete a minimum of 120 credit hours
2. Complete at least 25% of the required courses at NKU

3. Complete the last 30 credit hours at NKU
4. Complete at least 45 credit hours numbered 300 level or above
5. Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA across all major coursework
6. Meet all requirements for the major
7. Completion of a minor, focus, or second major (if required by major)

Special opportunities for our BSW students:

- Public Child Welfare Certification Program (PCWCP). PCWCP is a selective-admission, pre-employment opportunity for social work majors that pays in-state tuition for the last three or four semesters and pre-semester stipend benefits. PCWCP is a statewide collaboration among the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services and 11 Kentucky social work programs. The purpose of the program is to provide BSW the opportunity to receive advanced training in the area of child welfare protection and permanency. After graduation, PCWCP students are required to become employed by the Kentucky Department of Health & Family Services, Department of Child Protection & Permanency for a minimum of two years.
- Scholarship opportunities for social work majors. Information is available from the Office of Student Financial Assistance.
- Micro-credentials in specific social work areas:
  - Forensic social work
  - Gerontology

Special opportunities for BSW graduates:

- Ability to apply to admission for the advanced standing, one-year, MSW program (30 credit hours instead of 60 credit hours).
- Ability to obtain professional state social work license

### ***General Transfer Information***

Students must complete the online application to NKU. There is no application fee for students who are transferring from a KCTCS institution.

**KCTCS Scholars Award:** Students who are KY residents transferring directly from a KCTCS institution with at least 36 hours from that institution and minimum GPA of 3.0, were never enrolled as a degree-seeking student at NKU, and will be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours both fall and spring semester are eligible for a limited number of annual scholarships (per fall and spring only) Students must gain admission to NKU by June 15 for fall and November 1 for spring to be eligible for a possible scholarship. Online accelerated programs are not eligible for the KCTCS Scholars Award.
